

America in Moral Decline

The number of Americans who attend religious services of any kind is on the decline. Heaven and hell are not real to the followers of hedonistic religiosity. The rejection of the Bible as the literally inspired word of God (2 Tim. 3:16, 17), and the authority for how people should live their lives is becoming more widespread. Statistics show that more and more people identify themselves as agnostic or even atheistic. Such unbelievable cruelties as the above, once virtually unknown, are becoming far too common all across our land.

The two most revealing moral issues of where we are as a country, homosexuality and abortion, continue to gain the acceptance, if not the approval, of more and more of our citizens, including many who disingenuously claim to honor Christ and be His followers. The presence of an administration and congress in Washington D.C. favoring the side of sin in both of these issues cannot help but to fuel the shift of many from loving goodness and hating evil to doing just the opposite.

Sex outside of marriage is no longer taboo. Motherhood outside of marriage is virtually glorified, and one public figure after another comes forward shedding crocodile tears not from the guilt of an extra-marital affair, but because they were found out. The number of divorces may be on the decline, but who should be surprised when couples aren't married, but only shackled up.

Lying is a way of life for many. After all, if it gets you out of trouble, it is not only a possible action to take, but the right one. Unethical treatment of one's fellow citizens is so rampant the dockets of small claims courts are full and running over.
