

THE CRIMINALIZATION OF CHRISTIANITY

One religion serves a false God (Allah), who sends his adherents out with the message to accept this religion or die. Nineteen of those adherents hijacked airplanes and flew them into the Pentagon, and into the twin towers of New York's World Trade Center, killing over 3000 American citizens. Another religion serves a God who took on flesh came to the earth and died for the sins of mankind, that men might come unto Him and have salvation. It seems like a no brainer question to ask: "Which of those two religions faces the greatest possibility of being criminalized and finally outlawed, not only in New York, but all across the United States?" Reason says it has to be the first one, right? As former college football coach turned analyst, Lee Corso, is famous for saying, "Not so fast!"

For almost three decades now, those who believe in Jesus Christ as the Savior of the world, have been called names like Nazis, bigots, extremists, and hate mongers. They have been ridiculed and had lawsuits brought against them in attempts to shut their mouths from speaking the hateful message that Jesus came to die on the cross for the sins of humanity (John 3:16; 1 John 2:2). Through "hate crimes" legislation, the enemies of Christianity have made strides toward having this "hateful" religion made illegal.

At the same time, public schools all across the nation force students to dress up and act out the religious practices of this religion, while media and government officials caution the folks against jumping to conclusions about a killer who before he started gunning down innocent people shouted out, "*Allahu Akbar*," meaning, "God is great."

Do you shake your head in amazement and confusion why a religion whose battle cry from its very beginning has been, "Islam or the sword," is viewed as one of the world's great religions, while Christianity, the true religion of peace, and established by the Prince of Peace (Isa. 9:6; Eph. 2:15), faces criminalization? It doesn't help very much when the world's most prolific distributor of disinformation, Al Gore, compared George W. Bush's belief in Christianity with fundamentalist Islam. It is not really all that difficult to understand why Christianity is under attack if you know one thing; an increasing number of people, 64% of adults and 83% of teenagers now believe that moral truth is relative. Every pro-choice legislator ought to be compelled to watch a partial birth abortion procedure.

Belief in the Christian religion was present and foundational at the beginning of this nation. Even those who purport to be followers of Christ, but are not because their doctrine is wrong, have nevertheless always proclaimed the reality that the Bible condemns sin.
